Construction of Ottawa's New City Hall Engineering, Architectural Triumph

Perini Limited workers have almost finished the construction of Ottawa's new City Hall, a large modern building of the City of Ottawa. The work by Perini Limited was the last task connected with the construction of the \$2,400,000 building, and a climax to 20 months of continuous activity on the Ottawa Island site.

Perini Limited, after general contract and 12 sub-contracting firms were engaged on the City Hall project. They paid out over \$1,500,000 to wages and bought hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of concrete, timber, brick, paint, the steel reinforcement bars, and other materials from local suppliers. At periods of peak activity as many as 300 workmen were employed on the site. Engineers, architects, electrical tradesmen and others, they represented almost every aspect of the building industry.
